

Three Day Health & Safety in Agriculture & Horticulture

Course Description:

A training course instructed above Level 3 specifically designed for Land-based & Environmental Business including Construction Plant, followed by a City & Guilds NPTC qualification.

Aims:

This course is aimed at owner/managers within the land-based and environmental sector, freelance training consultants, forestry contractors, company directors or managers, Health & Safety supervisors, construction plant managers/supervisors, CPCS and land-based instructors, assessors, internal and external verifiers, TSV's, training providers, assessment centre managers, college tutors, etc. Included in the 3 day course fee are

- A team of two experienced instructors

- An easily accessible modern training centre in a rural environment

- Park Hill Training Certificate of Attendance

Course times are 9.00am—5.00pm. All refreshments—lunch, teas & coffees are provided, trainees only need to bring suitable outdoor clothing for the practical sessions.

The three day course is followed on the 4th day by the City & Guilds online assessment. Delegates will also be set a work based assignment which will need to be completed in order to obtain the qualification.
