

## Aerial Tree Pruning 21-13

### Course Description

This course is for any person employed in arboriculture or forestry who is an experienced user of the chainsaw and/or other pruning tools and working from a rope and harness in conjunction with a ground person in medium sized open grown trees.

- Validation of Risk Assessment for course
- Understanding of the types of pruning and use
- Understanding of the theory of crown thinning and reduction
- Awareness of the safety considerations to be observed in organising the work site
- Ability to carry out crown reduction operations safely and efficiently.
