Venue Requirements (if course is at your site)

Room/ Area Required

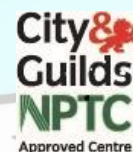
- For theory sessions: A dry, clean and warm room with power supply and tables and chairs for all trainees for theory sessions.
- Flipchart or whiteboard and marker pens.
- Suitable animal species for handling.
- Washroom and toilet facilities.
- First Aid Equipment.
- Fire Extinguisher.

Equipment Required

- Suitable animal species for handling in a separate area (crate, pen, halter, muzzle, hutch etc.) one animal per person where animals can be easily stressed.
- Safe restraining equipment if necessary and simulated application of topical; Vaseline, and oral medicines; smarties/polo/water. **For agricultural animals e.g. cattle, sheep, pigs and goats; one of the application methods must be by injection which cannot be simulated so must be required by the animal.**
- A recording system.
- Trainees must wear suitable outdoor clothing.
- Animal Health Management Plan for reference.
- Weigh tape or scales depending on species.

Other Requirements

- Upon arrival on site the instructor may postpone the training or assessment if the equipment or site are unsuitable, this also includes assessments if there isn't an animal which needs an injection, to comply with animal welfare, we are unable to inject with a simulated product. Payment will still be due and there will be an extra cost for the rescheduled day.
- All trainees must be fit enough for the training or assessment.
- We require one passport sized photograph of the candidate to be supplied electronically before the assessment or taken at the time of the assessment otherwise extra costs will be incurred to provide an ID card later.
