VENUE REQUIREMENTS (if course is at your site)

Room/ Area Required

- For theory sessions: A dry, clean and warm room with power supply, tables and chairs for all trainees.
- Flipchart or whiteboard and marker pens.
- Washroom and toilet facilities.
- First Aid Equipment.
- Fire Extinguisher.

Equipment Required

- Batch Dipping equipment in good clean working order.
- Operator manuals for equipment provided.
- Measuring jugs
- Measuring tapes
- Calculators
- Water supply
- PPE for all trainees to include protective coveralls e.g. DuPont Tyvek Type 4/5 5/6, wellington boots, visors, nitrile gloves & apron

Other Requirements

- Upon arrival on site the instructor may postpone the training or assessment if the equipment or site are unsuitable. Payment will still be due and there will be an extra cost for the rescheduled day.
- All trainees must be fit enough for the training or assessment.
- We require one passport sized photograph of the candidate to be supplied electronically before the assessment or taken at the time of the assessment otherwise extra costs will be incurred to provide an ID card later.
