Safe Use of Stem Injection Venue Requirements (if course is at your site)

Room/ Area Required

- For theory sessions: A dry, clean and warm room with power supply, tables and chairs for all trainees.
- Flipchart or whiteboard and marker pens.
- Thick stemmed plant or something similar to simulate Japanese Knotweed.
- Washroom and toilet facilities.
- First Aid Equipment.
- · Fire Extinguisher.

Equipment Required

- At least 1 injection kit between 2 trainees, complete with safety labels, manual and in good working order.
- Operator manual.
- PPE for all trainees to include protective coveralls e.g. DuPont Tyvek Type 4/5 5/6, wellington boots, visors & nitrile gloves

Other Requirements

- Upon arrival on site the instructor may postpone the training or assessment if the equipment or site
 are unsuitable. Payment will still be due and there will be an extra cost for the rescheduled day.
- All trainees must be fit enough for the training or assessment.
- We require one passport sized photograph of the candidate to be supplied electronically before the assessment otherwise extra costs will be incurred to provide an ID card later.
